This winter comic activity can be used as a writing center, small group task, or enrichment activity.

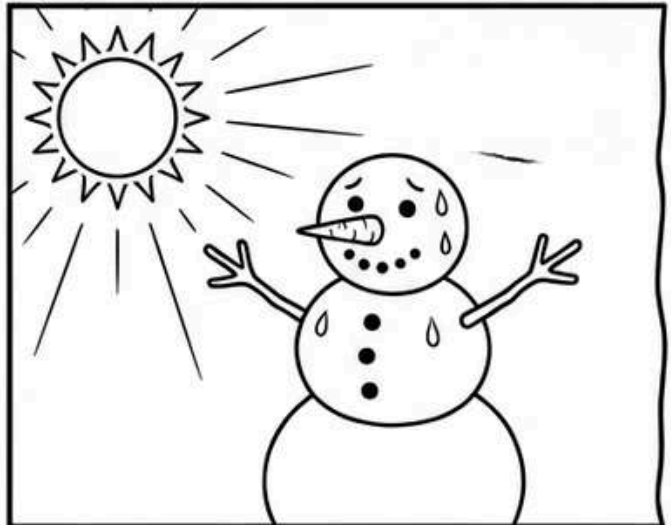
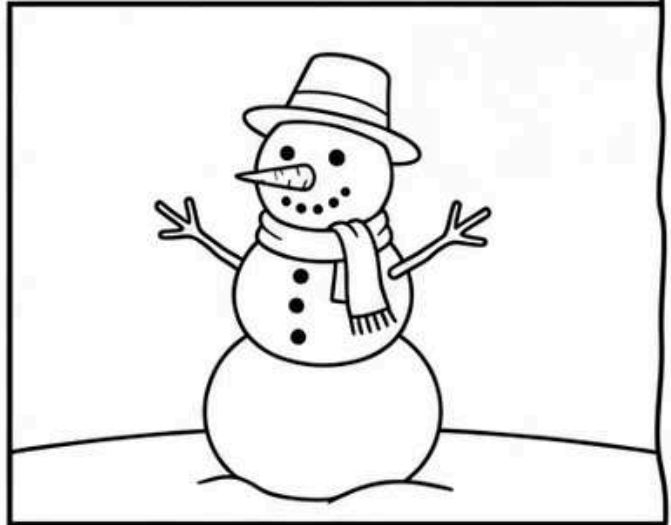
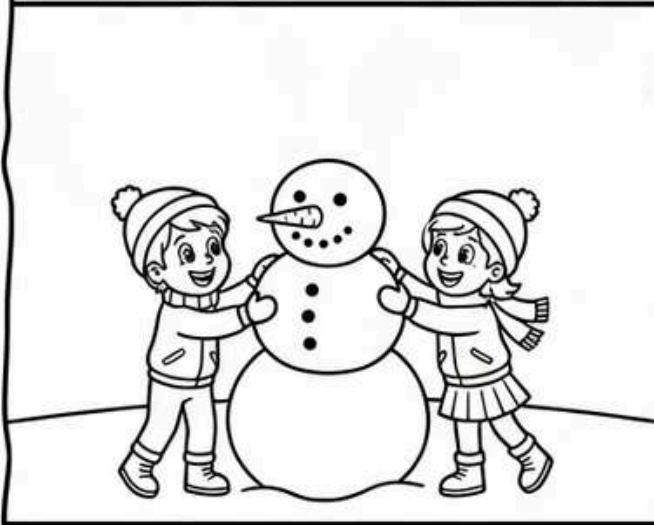
Teachers may choose the guided or open version based on students' writing levels, or use both for differentiated instruction.
